Horseshoe Lake Road Re-opens

Trent-Severn Waterway National Historic Site

Peterborough, Ontario, September 15, 2017 – Parks Canada is pleased to advise that Horseshoe Lake Road (County Road 20) near the Horseshoe Lake Dam, South of Bethel Road, has re-opened. One lane of the road has been closed to facilitate work to replace Horseshoe Lake Dam, part of the Trent-Severn Waterway National Historic Site.

Poor weather and the unprecedented high water levels made completion of this project especially challenging. Parks Canada thanks community members for their patience during this closure.

Parks Canada is investing an unprecedented \$3 billion over 5 years to support infrastructure work to heritage, tourism, waterway, and highway assets located within national historic sites, national parks, and national marine conservation areas across Canada. This investment will ensure these cherished places are protected and secured for the future.
